Distribution 1 (383 students)	\$478,750	Pell Eligible Students
Distribution 2 (83 students)	\$91,000	Special Circumstance: students that have had significant financial strain due to COVID-19
Distribution 3 (8 students)	\$6,660	Hotel Grants: students that were unable to go home to quarantine due to distance or living situation. Students were given \$90 each night they stayed in the hotel.
Distribution 4 (293 students)	\$219,750	Students that have an EFC reported on their FAFSA between 5800 and 20000.
Distribution 5 (636 students)	\$722,509	Students that received a grant in the fall (Distributions 1-3) received the same amount in the spring
Distribution 6 (643 students)	\$257,200	All residential, full-time, undergraduate students that have not already received a HEERF grant

Distribution 1 includes all students eligible for Pell grant that received a HEERF III grant of \$1,250.

Distribution 2 is a collection of students interviewed by phone that have experienced significant financial strain due to Covid-19. Students received grants of either \$500, \$1,000, or \$2,500 depending on their need and circumstances.

Distribution 3 is a group of students that quarantined in a hotel and received a HEERF III grant of \$90 per night they stayed in the hotel.

Distribution 4 includes all students that have an EFC reported on their FAFSA between 5800 and 20000. This range was decided due to these students just missing eligibility for Pell grant and are taking out large amounts of loans. Each student received a HEERF III grant of \$750.

Distribution 5 consists of those who received a HEERF III grant in the fall. Students received the same amount in the spring that they were granted in the fall semester.

Distribution 6 is what was done with the remaining funds after the institution felt that students with the greatest need and most outstanding circumstances were awarded an adequate amount. Any residential, full-time, undergraduate student that had not already received a HEERF III grant was given a \$400 grant. (This group does not include freshmen students, as they were awarded after the end of this quarter.)
